SHANGHAI, June 21.-(A)-Chinese Nationalist planes today damaged the British Blue Funnel Line freighter Anchises, injuring four crewmen. The war planes also fired Shell Oil Company warehouse. Three fighter-bombers staged the

raid. It was the second attack on Shanghai in 24 hours, The 8000 Anchises was beached. In the bomb-started fire at the Shell warehouse 20,000 Aons of kerosene and other petroleum prod-

ucts were destroyed The raid resulted in the diversion of several foreign ships from this port, normally one of the world's busiest. All foreign shipping is likely to stop immediately.

Mrs. Daley is a member of the California State Centennials Advisory Committee appointed by Gov. Earl Warren. FUNDS CUT IN HALF

Reaffirming the organization's interest in preservation of California history and honoring of the state's heroic pioneers, the NDGW resolution asks that the unexpended 1948-1949 centennial budget funds be devoted to the observances, in view of the fact that the centennial budget has suffered a 50 per cent cut by the State Legislature Conference

Committee. 




